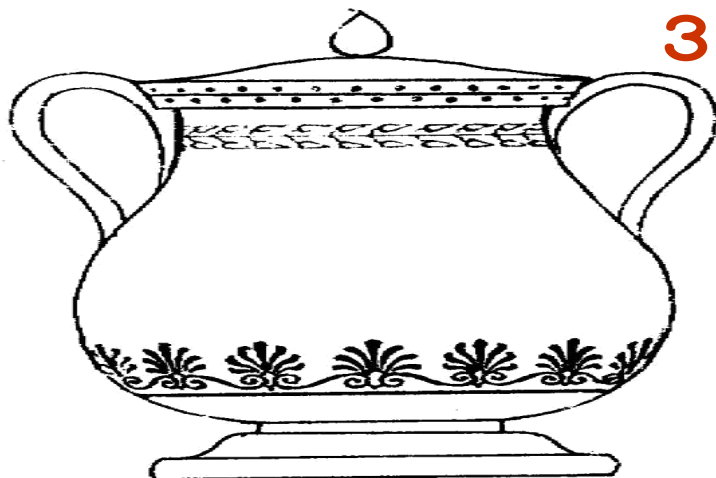
My Book About Greece
