How many names does this war have?

In Europe it was known as the Seven Years' War. It began in North America and spread to Europe.

From the British viewpoint, the war came to be known as the French and Indian War (Britain's enemies in the war.)

The French who lived in Canada simply called it *Guerra de la Conquete* (War of Conquest) This was because they saw the British as conquerors who wanted to take away their land.

To the American Indians who fought on both sides, it was a war about maintaining alliances for their trade goods.



Later, U.S. historians name it the French and Indian War. They saw them as the enemies of the British. However, the various Indian nations fought for both the French and British.
