Fold in half and glue this part to your page.



What was the French and Indian War?

The French and their American Indian friends fought one side and the British and their American colonists fought on the other side. Various Indian nations ended up fighting on both sides.

The French and Indian War was a fight to see which world empire would control North America and their colonies. It was also a product of rivalry between the British and French colonist.

In 1753 the French lead soldiers to build forts in the Ohio Country. A young George Washington was sent to delivery a letter demanding they withdraw. A year later Washington attempted to force the French to leave and the warbegan.
