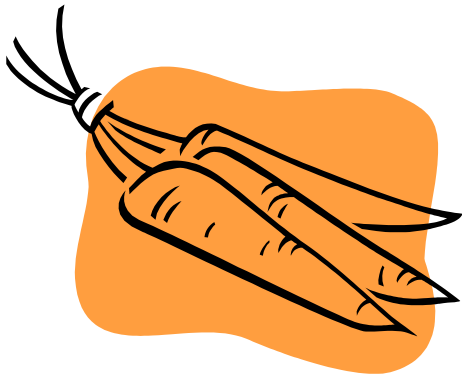
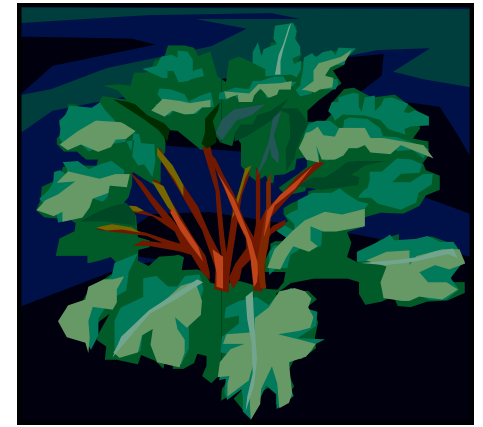

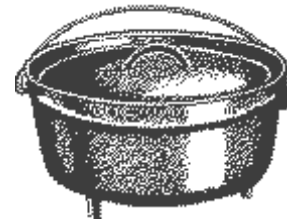

Flap

Pioneer Children had plenty of time walking along the wagon and occasionally riding in the wagon to learn the plants. Can you name the parts to a plant?

Cut out all pieces on outside borders only. Turn book over so that blank side is *facing up*. The picture of the carrot (celery, or lettuce) will be on *your right* and facing *down*.

Make your creases so that they will serve as a guideline to glue by. Bring in carrot, (celery, or lettuce) side to the middle and crease on line. Bring top down and crease.

*Note:* Top does not go all the way down to meet bottom.

Open back up. Glue turnip (Rhubarb, or cabbage) picture in center under middle crease line. Glue turnip (Rhubarb, or cabbage) label on the right flap. Glue carrot (celery, or lettuce) label on top flap.

Fold in carrot (celery, or lettuce) flap to the middle.

Fold down top and glue “Roots” (Stalk, or Leaves) label at bottom.

Note for a slightly older child, have them write the parts and practice penmanship.

If they are not so old, (lol) but don’t want to write, use the premade labels.

Use Flap as a cover page if you like to: Glue along top edge only and place over mini books to look like this:
