When he was a young boy, he spent most of his time exploring unmapped places and visiting the friendly Indians.

It wasn't until 1769 that Daniel Boone could explore the unmapped places of his childhood memories with his old friend, John Finley.



After he married Rebecca Bryan, he spent the next few years hunting and fishing



Shortly after his family moved to North Carolina, young Daniel left his home with a military expedition in the French and Indian War.



By the time he was twelve years old, he was an excellent hunter and provided wild game for his family.

Instructions for meander book:

Cut on solid black lines around edge of whole page.

Cut on the three bold black horizontal lines, but do *not cut all the way through*.

When you get to page 3, fold page 2 *under* page 3. Then continue accordion fold on that row.

When you get to page 6, fold page 6 under page 7.

Continue accordion fold on that row.

When you get to page 10, fold page 10 under 11.

Continue accordion fold.
