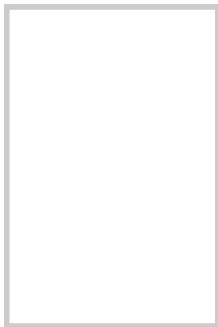
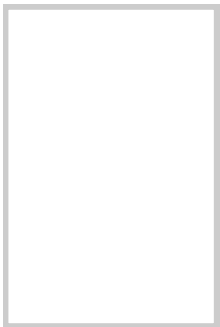
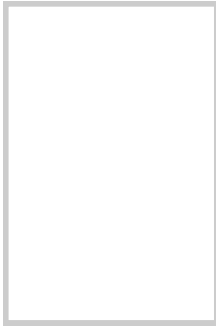
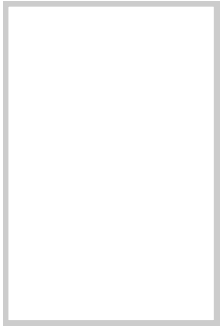
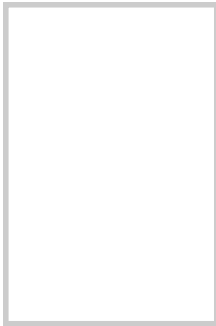
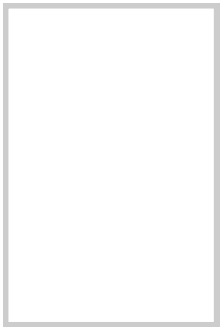


Even though James Marshall was not the first to discover gold in January, 1848, he is credited with starting the gold rush.

90,000 gold seekers came in 1849 alone, earning them the name "49ers".

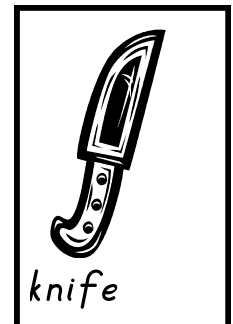
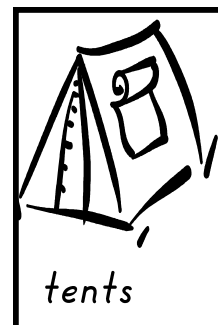
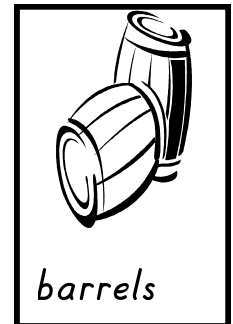
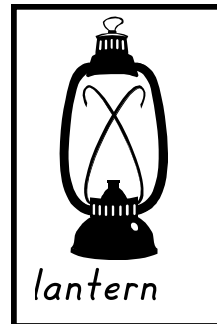
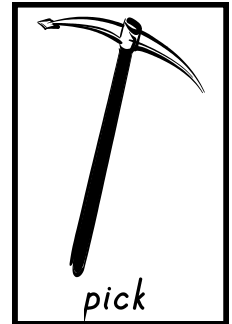
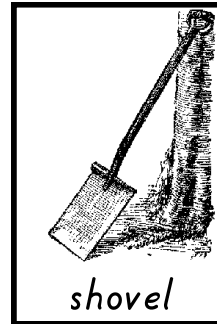
Gold seekers took many routes to get to California. Some followed the Oregon Trail and Santa Fe Trail. Others came on ship along the Cape Horn Route.

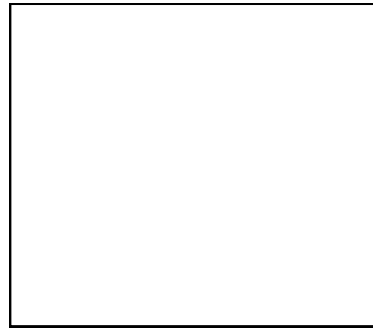
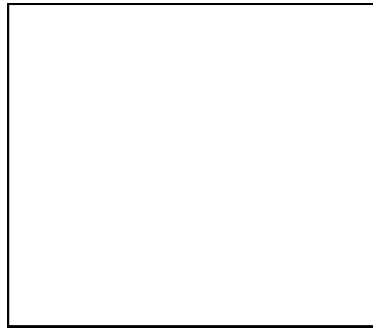
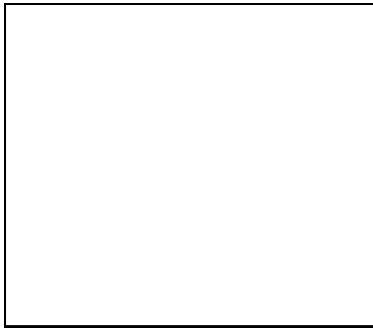

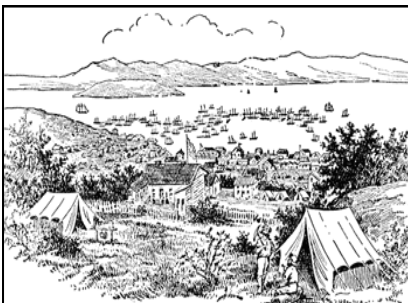
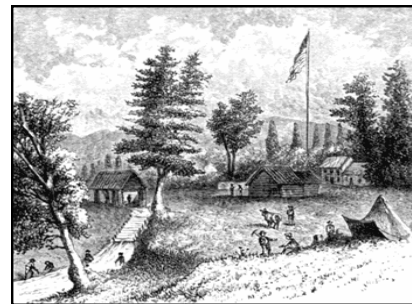
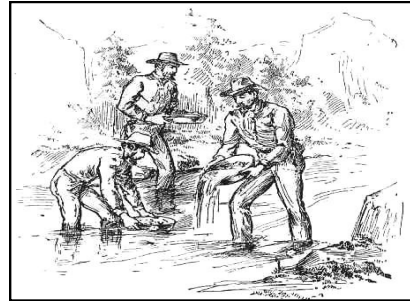


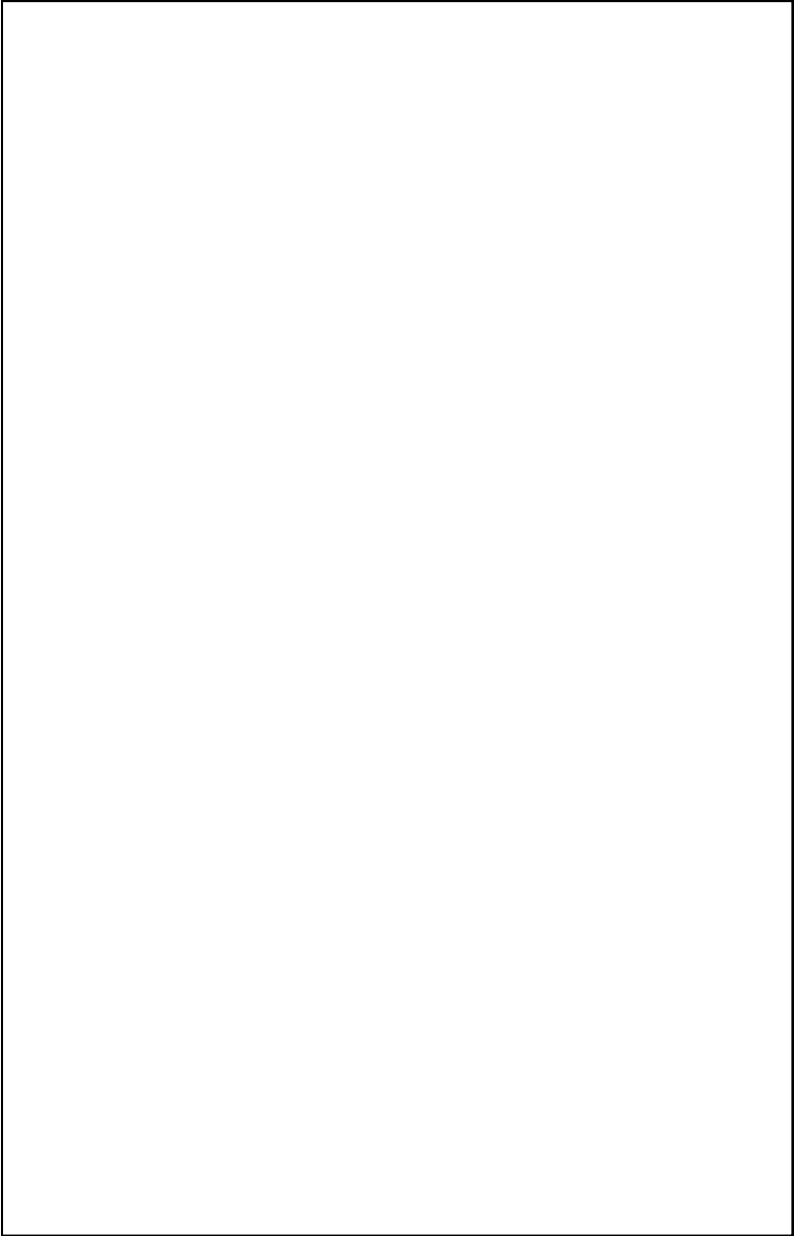
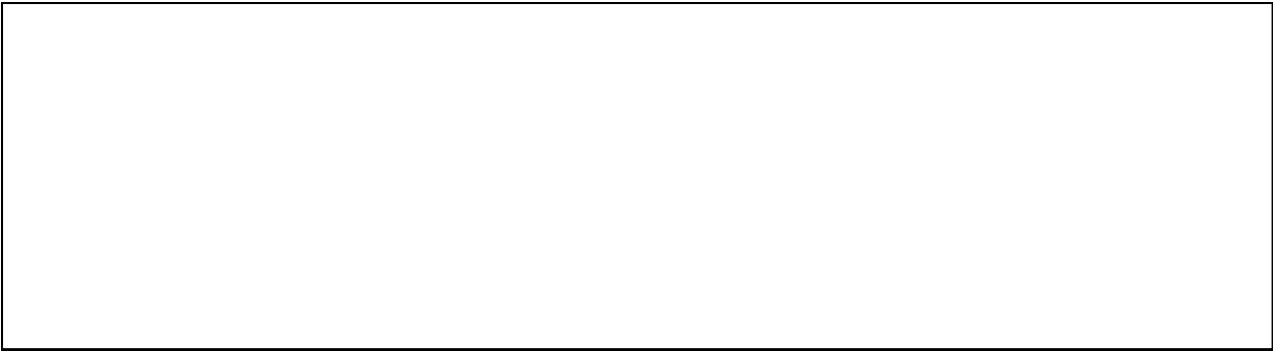
List tools and equipment used by miners:
