

Answers

Amphibian comes from the Greek. "Amphi" means double and "bios" means life. Double life or part of their life is spent in water and part on land.

They are ectothermic or cold blooded. They depend on an external energy source to provide their bodies with the needed heat.

They normally have four legs.

The surface of their skin is normally slippery or smooth in frogs and more dry and bumpy in toads.
