Materials need: Game cards on next page, one die and one token for each game player.

Print game cards on cardstock. Cut out cards for game and shuffle them. Place face down.

Object of the game: Be the first one to storm the Bastille.

Directions: Each player rolls a die to see who goes first. If you land on a green space, then follow the instructions.

If you land on the guillotine, then you must draw a card and follow those instructions.

The card is returned to the bottom of the pile.

For tokens: Use a penny, dime and nickel or use tokens from your other games like we did.

You have ran out of bread, the main staple in the French diet at the time of the Revolution. You are too hungry to go on.

Go Back 2 Spaces

Having read Rousseau's *The Social Contract* of 1762 which states that government should be a social contract between men, you are enlightened.

Go Forward 3 Spaces.

You have been distracted playing *jeu de quills* (bowling).

Go Back 3 Spaces.

You understand the 3 estates or level of French society. The first estate is made up of clergy. Nobles are the second estate and peasants are the third estate and largest.

Go Forward 3 Spaces.

Oh no, the King wants a new tax law to stabilize the economy.

Go Back 1 Space

In the summer of 1791, you didn't want to be found by the mobs trying to find Louis XVI and Marie Antoinette when they tried to flee to Austria.

Go Forward 2 Spaces.

You have been listening to Dr. Joseph Guillotin as he explains to the government that beheading is the quickest and least painful way to carry out a death sentence.

Go Back 3 Spaces.

You are distracted by measuring the height of the guillotine, which was around 14 feet tall. *(About the top of a basket ball backboard.)*

Go back 3 spaces.

You have been a good neighbor by helping out your neighbor with his crop so he does not starve to death like most of the common French people.

Go Forward 3 Spaces.

You took time to notice the fancy and excessive fashions of the eighteenth century and you saw the *coiffure* (hairstyle) of Queen Antoinette.

Go Forward 2 Spaces.

In 1796 you meet Napoleon Bonaparte, now in his twenties.

Go Forward 2 Spaces.

Oh no, King Louis is out hunting again while the French people are starving.

Go Backward 3 Spaces.

You have transported to the future and understand that historical fiction will be written about this time period through the books *Les Miserables* and *A Tale of Two Cities*.

Go Forward 1 Space

You have taken time to listen to Napoleon's speeches in 1796 to his troops in Italy.

Go Back 2 Spaces.

You have been marching faster as you listened to *Ca Ira*, a song of the Revolution.

Go forward 2 Spaces.

Trying to measure using the metric system, it takes you longer to figure out that 1 meter is roughly 1 yard.

Go back 2 spaces.
