Materials need: Game cards on next page, one die and one token for each game player.

Print game cards on the next page on cardstock. Cut out cards for game and shuffle them. Place face down.

Object of the game: Be the first one to race through the events of the life of Wyatt Earp.

Directions: Each player rolls a die to see who goes first. If you land on a yellow space, then follow the instructions.

If you land on the star, then you must draw a card and follow those instructions.

The card is returned to the bottom of the pile.

For tokens: Use a penny, dime and nickel or use tokens from your other games like we did.
